A BILL

To prohibit the Transportation Security Administration from asking passengers on domestic flights for information regarding vaccinations.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Freedom To Fly Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON REQUESTING VACCINATION IN-
- 6 FORMATION FROM PASSENGERS ON DOMES-
- 7 TIC FLIGHTS.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland Secu-
- 9 rity and the Administrator of the Transportation Security
- 10 Administration may not prescribe or implement any regu-

- 1 lation or policy that would allow employees of the Trans-
- 2 portation Security Administration to request information
- 3 relating to vaccinations from any passenger traveling on
- 4 a flight between States or territories or possessions of the
- 5 United States.
- 6 (b) Rule of Construction.—Subsection (a) does
- 7 not limit the authority of the Director of the Centers for
- 8 Disease Control and Prevention to issue guidance or pre-
- 9 scribe regulations relating to public health.
