CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing support for designation of October 28 as "Honoring the Nation's First Responders Day".

- Whereas first responders include all professional and volunteer fire, police, emergency medical technician (EMT), and paramedic workers in the United States;
- Whereas there are over 25,300,000 first responders in the United States working to keep the Nation's communities safe;
- Whereas first responders deserve to be recognized for their commitment to safety, defense, and honor; and
- Whereas October 28 would be an appropriate day to establish as "Honoring the Nation's First Responders Day": Now, therefore, be it

1	Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
2	concurring), That the House of Representatives—
3	(1) supports the designation of "Honoring the
4	Nation's First Responders Day";
5	(2) honors and recognizes the contributions of
6	first responders; and
7	(3) encourages the people of the United States
8	to observe "Honoring the Nation's First Responders
9	Day' with appropriate ceremonies and activities that
10	promote awareness of the contributions of the Na-
11	tion's first responders.
