A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County – Alcoholic Beverages – Beauty Salon License**

3 **MC 3–25**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a holder of a beauty salon license in Montgomery County
5 to provide a certain amount of liquor for on–premises consumption in addition to
6 beer and wine; altering the amount of beer the holder may provide for on–premises
7 consumption; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Montgomery
8 County.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis**

22 25–102.

23 This title applies only in Montgomery County.

1 25–1002.

2 (a) There is a beauty salon beer [and], wine, **AND LIQUOR** license.

3 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a beauty salon permit issued
4 under § 5–501 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article.

5 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to provide not more than **12 OUNCES**
6 **OF BEER**, 5 ounces of [beer or] wine [by the glass], **OR 1.7 OUNCES OF LIQUOR** for
7 on–premises consumption by a beauty salon customer:

8 (1) when the customer is provided a cosmetology service under § 5–101(n)
9 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; or

10 (2) while the customer is attending a fund–raising event at the beauty
11 salon for which the County Department of Permitting Services has issued a permit.

12 (d) The license may not be transferred to another location.

13 (e) The license holder may provide beer [and], wine, **AND LIQUOR** during normal
14 business hours but not later than 9 p.m.

15 (f) An establishment for which the license is issued is subject to the alcohol
16 awareness training requirements under § 4–505 of this article.

17 (g) The annual license fee is \$100.

18 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That this Act shall take effect July
19 1, 2025.
