A BILL

To amend the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act to expand the purposes of the corporation, to designate the United States Center for Safe Sport, and for other purposes.

Designation of United States Center for 1 2 Safe Sport 3 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The United States Center for Safe Sport (referred to in this subchapter as the 'Center') 4 5 shall 6 "(1) serve as the independent national safe 7 sport organization and be recognized worldwide as 8 the independent national safe sport organization for 9 the United States: 10 "(2) exercise jurisdiction over the corporation, 11 each national governing body, and each paralympic 12 sports organization with regard to safeguarding 13 amateur athletes against abuse, including emotional, 14 physical, and sexual abuse, in sports; 15 "(3) maintain an office for education and out-16 reach that shall develop training, oversight practices, 17 policies, and procedures to prevent the abuse, includ-18 ing emotional, physical, and sexual abuse, of ama-19 teur athletes participating in amateur athletic activi-20 through national governing **bodies** ties and 21 paralympic sports organizations; 22 "(4) ensure that the policies and procedures 23 under paragraph (3) include requirements that all 24 national governing bodies and paralympic sports or-25 ganizations follow the policies and procedures of the

Center;

"(5) maintain an office for response and resolution that shall establish mechanisms that allow for the reporting, investigation, and adjudication of alleged sexual abuse in violation of the Center's policies and procedures; and

"(6) ensure that the mechanisms under paragraph (5) provide fair notice and an opportunity to be heard and protect the privacy and safety of complainants.

"(b) Policies and Procedures.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Center may, in its discretion, utilize a neutral arbitration body and develop policies and procedures to resolve allegations of sexual abuse within its jurisdiction.

"(2) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this section shall be construed as altering, superseding, or otherwise affecting the right of an amateur athlete to pursue criminal or civil justice through the courts.

"(e) Limitation on Liability.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in paragraph (2), the Center, and each national governing body and paralympic sports organization, including any officer, employee, or agent thereof, shall not be liable for damages in any civil action for defamation,

libel, slander, or damage to reputation arising out of any action or communication, if the action arises from the execution of the responsibilities or functions described in this section, section 220532, or section 220533.

"(2) EXCEPTION.—Paragraph (1) shall not apply in any action in which the Center, a national governing body, or a paralympic sports organization, or an officer, employee, or agent thereof, acted with actual malice, or provided information or took action not pursuant to this section, section 220532, or section 220533.

<u></u>§ 220532. Additional duties.**

"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Center shall—

"(1) develop training, oversight practices, policies, and procedures for implementation by a national governing body or paralympic sports organization to prevent the abuse, including emotional, physical, and sexual abuse, of any amateur athlete; and "(2) include in the policies and procedures developed under section 220531(a)(3)—

"(A) a requirement that all adult members of a national governing body, a paralympic sports organization, or a facility under the jurisdiction of a national governing body or

paralympic sports organization, and all adults authorized by such members to interact with an amateur athlete, report immediately any allegation of sexual abuse of an amateur athlete who is a minor to law enforcement authorities and other appropriate authorities, including the Center, whenever such members or adults learn of facts leading them to suspect reasonably that an amateur athlete who is a minor has suffered an incident of sexual abuse;

"(B) a mechanism, approved by a trained expert on child abuse, that allows a complainant to report easily an incident of sexual abuse to the Center, a national governing body, law enforcement authorities, or other appropriate authorities;

"(C) reasonable procedures to limit one-onone interactions between an amateur athlete
who is a minor and an adult (who is not the minor's legal guardian) at a facility under the jurisdiction of a national governing body or
paralympic sports organization without being in
an observable and interruptible distance from
another adult, except under exigent circumstances;

1	"(D) procedures to prohibit retaliation, by

3	sports organization, against any individual who
