Mr. Cicilline (for himself, Mr. Bilirakis, Mr. Sarbanes, Mr. Yoho, Mr. Pallone, Mr. Aderholt, Mr. McGovern, and Mr. Poe of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To limit the transfer of F-35 aircraft to Turkey.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON TRANSFER OF F-35 AIRCRAFT
- 4 TO TURKEY.
- 5 (a) In General.—Except as provided in subsection
- 6 (b), none of the funds authorized to be appropriated to
- 7 the Department of Defense or any other Federal depart-
- 8 ment or agency may be used to—

1	(1) facilitate the transfer, or authorize the
2	transfer of, an F–35 aircraft to Turkey; or
3	(2) transfer intellectual property or technical
4	data necessary for or related to any maintenance or
5	support of such F-35 aircraft.
6	(b) Exceptions.—The President may waive the lim-
7	itation under subsection (a) upon written certification to
8	Congress that the Government of Turkey is not—
9	(1) taking steps to degrade NATO interoper-
10	ability;
11	(2) exposing NATO assets to hostile actors;
12	(3) degrading the general security of NATO
13	member states;
14	(4) seeking to import or purchase defense arti-
15	cles from a foreign country with respect to which
16	sanctions are imposed by the United States;
17	(5) wrongfully or unlawfully detaining one or
18	more nationals of the United States or aliens law-
19	fully admitted for permanent residence in the United
20	States; or
21	(6) engaging in military action without taking
22	proper steps to ensure that international legal norms
23	are followed to prevent civilian deaths and suffering.
