A BILL

To amend the National and Community Service Act of 1990 to ensure DACA recipients are eligible for educational awards.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "AmeriCorps Access
- 5 for Dreamers Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR DACA RECIPIENTS.
- 7 Section 146(a)(3) of the National and Community
- 8 Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12602(a)(3)) is amended
- 9 by inserting before the period at the end the following:

- 1 ", or is an individual granted deferred action pursuant to
- 2 the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals policy an-
- 3 nounced by the Secretary of Homeland Security on June
- 4 15, 2012 (without regard to the limitations imposed under
- 5 subtitle A of title IV of the Personal Responsibility and
- 6 Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (8 U.S.C.
- 7 1611 et seq.))".

8 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 9 The amendment made by this Act shall take effect
- 10 on the date of enactment of this Act, and shall apply with
- 11 respect to educational awards disbursed on or after the
- 12 date of enactment of this Act.
