FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, in collaboration with the Maryland Department of Health, to develop a comprehensive health education framework: requiring each county board of education to create an age-appropriate curriculum that is consistent with the comprehensive health education framework: requiring each county board to establish a method by which a parent or guardian may opt out of certain topics, subject to certain requirements; requiring each county board to report each year to the State Department of Education on certain actions: and generally relating to the establishment of a comprehensive health education framework in public schools each county board of education to follow the policy and guidelines for the program of instruction for public schools established by the State Board of Education; requiring the State Superintendent to provide notice to a county board if the State Superintendent determines that the county board is not following the State Board policy and guidelines or is authorizing students to opt-out of instruction in a manner that is not approved by the State Board; requiring the State Superintendent to direct the State Comptroller to withhold certain funds from the county board if the county board does not resolve the discrepancy within certain periods of time; requiring the State Comptroller to release funds withheld if the State Superintendent determines that the county board has resolved the discrepancy; and
