RESOLUTION

Recognizing January 28, 2017, as “National Data Privacy
Day”.

Whereas, on January 28, 2017, National Data Privacy Day
is recognized;

Whereas technology has enhanced our ability to communicate,
learn, and work and is now a part of our everyday lives;

Whereas personal information has become a form of cur-
rency;

Whereas it is easier now than ever before to share personal
information with friends, colleagues, and companies;

Whereas the sharing of personal information may compromise
the privacy of individuals if appropriate protective action
is not taken;

Whereas governments, corporations, and individuals have a role in protecting the privacy of individuals; and

Whereas National Data Privacy Day constitutes a nationwide effort to educate and raise awareness about respecting privacy and safeguarding data: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate—

2 (1) recognizes January 28, 2017, as “National
3 Data Privacy Day”; and

4 (2) encourages governments, individuals, pri-
5 vacy professionals, educators, corporations, and
6 other relevant organizations to take steps to protect
7 the privacy of individuals.
