## A BILL

To amend the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995 to require Members of Congress to reimburse the Treasury for payments of awards and settlements under such Act which are made in connection with claims of sexual harassment committed by the Members, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Taxpayers Obli-
- 5 gations to Perpetrators of Sexual Harassment Act".

2	BURSE TREASURY FOR AMOUNTS PAID AS

7	(a) Mandating Reimbursement of Amounts
8	Paid.—Section 415 of the Congressional Accountability
9	Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1415) is amended by adding at
10	the end the following new subsection:
11	"(d) Reimbursement by Members of Congress
12	OF AMOUNTS PAID AS SETTLEMENTS AND AWARDS IN
13	CASES OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT.—
14	"(1) IN GENERAL.—If a payment is made from
15	the account described in subsection (a) for an award
16	or settlement in connection with an allegation of a
17	violation of section 201(a) which consists of an act
18	of sexual harassment committed personally by a
19	Member of the House of Representatives or a Sen-
20	ator, the Member or Senator shall reimburse the ac-
21	count for the amount of the award or settlement, in
22	accordance with procedures established by the Com-
23	mittee on House Administration of the House of
24	Representatives (in the case of a Member of the
25	House, including a Delegate or Resident Commis-
26	sioner to the Congress) or the Committee on Rules

1	and Administration of the Senate (in the case of a
2	Senator).
3	"(2) Deadline.—A Member shall reimburse
4	the account described in subsection (a) for a pay-
5	ment described in paragraph (1) not later than 90
6	days after the payment is made.".
7	(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
8	subsection (a) shall apply with respect to payments made
9	on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
