A BILL

To examine the extent of the reliance of the United States on foreign producers for personal protective equipment during the COVID-19 pandemic and produce recommendations to secure the supply chain of personal protective equipment.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "PPE Supply Chain
- 5 Transparency Act of 2020".

1 SEC. 2. REPORT.

- 2 (a) Definition.—In this section, the terms "per-
- 3 sonal protective equipment" and "PPE" means protective
- 4 clothing, helmets, gloves, face shields, goggles, facemasks,
- 5 and other equipment designed to protect the wearer from
- 6 injury or the spread of infection or illness, as determined
- 7 by the Commissioner of Food and Drugs.
- 8 (b) Report.—Not later than 90 days after the date
- 9 of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal
- 10 Emergency Management Agency shall, in consultation
- 11 with the Secretary of Health and Human Services, submit
- 12 to the Committee on Homeland Security and Govern-
- 13 mental Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on Home-
- 14 land Security of the House of Representatives, and make
- 15 publicly available, a report examining the security and re-
- 16 silience of the supply chain for personal protective equip-
- 17 ment during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 18 (c) Contents.—The report required under sub-
- 19 section (a) shall—
- 20 (1) detail the volume and percentage of each
- 21 type of PPE distributed by, or at the direction of,
- the Federal Emergency Management Agency for
- 23 COVID-19 response efforts purchased or otherwise
- acquired or controlled in the delivery from a pro-
- ducer located outside the United States;

- 1 (2) detail the volume and percentage of each
 2 type of PPE distributed by, or at the direction of,
 3 the Federal Emergency Management Agency for
 4 COVID-19 response efforts purchased or otherwise
 5 acquired or controlled in the delivery from a pro6 ducer located in the United States;
 - (3) detail the volume and percentage of PPE imports acquired or controlled by the Federal Emergency Management Agency from a producer located in the People's Republic of China, which may include any relevant information collected on defective PPE acquired from Chinese producers;
 - (4) detail any challenges and obstacles related to procuring PPE from a producer not located in the United States during the COVID-19 pandemic, including export controls by foreign nations;
 - (5) forecast domestic demand for PPE on a monthly basis over the 1-year period beginning on the date of enactment of this Act;
 - (6) analyze whether domestic production of each type of PPE is sufficient to meet demand forecasted under paragraph (5); and
 - (7) include legislative recommendations to secure the supply chain of PPE, including recommendations to—

1	(A) improve resiliency in the supply chain
2	of PPE;
3	(B) increase domestic production of PPE;
4	and
5	(C) reduce the reliance of the United
6	States on foreign producers of PPE.

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
