## A BILL

To terminate the designation of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan as a major non-NATO ally, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF DESIGNATION OF THE IS-4 LAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN AS A MAJOR 5 NON-NATO ALLY. 6 (a) In General.—Effective beginning on the date 7 of the enactment of this Act— 8 (1) the designation of the Islamic Republic of 9 Pakistan as a major non-NATO ally pursuant to

section 517(a)(1) of the Foreign Assistance Act of

- 1 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321k(a)(1)) or any other provi-2 sion of law is hereby terminated; and 3 (2) the President may not issue a separate designation of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan as a 4 5 major non-NATO ally pursuant to section 517(a)(1) 6 of such Act or any other provision of law unless the 7 President submits to Congress a certification de-8 scribed in subsection (b). 9 (b) CERTIFICATION.—A certification described in this subsection is a certification that contains a determination 10 11 of the President that— 12 (1) Pakistan continues to conduct military oper-13 ations that are contributing to significantly dis-14 rupting the safe haven and freedom of movement of 15 the Haqqani Network in Pakistan; 16 (2) Pakistan has taken steps to demonstrate its
  - (2) Pakistan has taken steps to demonstrate its commitment to prevent the Haqqani Network from using any Pakistani territory as a safe haven;
  - (3) the Government of Pakistan actively coordinates with the Government of Afghanistan to restrict the movement of militants, such as the Haqqani Network, along the Afghanistan-Pakistan border; and
