Mr. LoBiondo introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a pilot program under which eligible veterans may elect to receive hospital care and medical services at non-Department of Veterans Affairs facilities, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Health ID
- 5 Act".

## SEC. 2. PILOT PROGRAM ON DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS 2 AFFAIRS FEE-BASIS HEALTH CARE. 3 (a) Pilot Program.—Beginning not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-4 5 retary of Veterans Affairs shall carry out a two-year pilot program under which— 6 7 (1) eligible veterans may elect to receive hos-8 pital care and medical services at non-Department of 9 Veterans Affairs facilities; and (2) the Secretary shall reimburse such facilities 10 11 for the cost of such care and services. 12 (b) ELIGIBLE VETERAN.—For purposes of the pilot 13 program under this section, an eligible veteran is a veteran 14 who— 15 (1) is enrolled in the patient enrollment system 16 of the Department of Veterans Affairs under section 17 1705 of title 38, United States Code; and 18 (2) resides in a geographic area selected by the 19 Secretary under subsection (c). 20 (c) Selection of Geographic Areas.—The Secretary shall select one geographic area within each Vet-22 erans Integrated Service Network for participation in the pilot program. For Veterans Integrated Service Network 4, the Secretary shall select NJ-2 as the geographic area 24 for participation in the pilot program.

- 1 (d) Identification Card.—Under the pilot pro-
- 2 gram, the Secretary shall issue to each eligible veteran
- 3 who elects to receive hospital care and medical services
- 4 at non-Department facilities a unique identification card.
- 5 The Secretary shall take such steps as may be necessary
- 6 to ensure that such veterans receive such care and services
- 7 at such non-Department facilities upon presentation of the
- 8 identification card.
- 9 (e) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the con-
- 10 clusion of the pilot program under this section, the Sec-
- 11 retary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs
- 12 of the Senate and House of Representatives a report on
- 13 the pilot program. Such report shall include the Sec-
- 14 retary's analysis of the success of the pilot program and
- 15 any recommendations for extending or expanding the pilot
- 16 program.
