A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Restoring Education
 - 5 And Learning Act of 2017" or the "REAL Act of 2017".
 - 6 SEC. 2. REINSTATEMENT OF FEDERAL PELL GRANT ELIGI-
 - 7 BILITY.
 - 8 Section 401(b) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
 - 9 (20 U.S.C. 1070a(b)) is amended—

- (1) by striking paragraph (6) and redesignating 1 2 paragraph (7) as paragraph (6); and 3 paragraph (2)(A)(ii), (2)in by striking "(7)(B)" and inserting "(6)(B)". 4 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. The amendments made by section 2 shall be effective 6 7 for academic year 2017–2018 and succeeding academic
- 8 years.
