### SECTION 1. HONORING THE LAST SURVIVING MEDAL OF

- 2 HONOR RECIPIENT OF WORLD WAR II.
- 3 (a) USE OF ROTUNDA.—The individual who is the
- 4 last surviving recipient of the Medal of Honor for acts per-
- 5 formed during World War II shall be permitted to lie in
- 6 state in the rotunda of the Capitol upon death, if the indi-
- 7 vidual (or the next of kin of the individual) so elects.
- 8 (b) IMPLEMENTATION.—The Architect of the Capitol,
- 9 under the direction of the President pro tempore of the
- 10 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
- 11 shall take the necessary steps to implement subsection (a).
