

- [(f)] (G) A manager of a dispensary, an individual who contracts to operate a retail outlet as authorized under subsection (c) of this section, or an employee of a dispensary or retail outlet who commits a prohibited act related to the sale or providing of alcoholic beverages to individuals under the age of 21 years under this article or the Criminal Law Article is subject to:
- 6 (1) any penalty authorized by law, including a civil citation issued under § 7 10-119 of the Criminal Law Article; and
- 8 (2) a fine and suspension or revocation of employment by the Board in the 9 same manner as a license holder or employee of a license holder would be subject to a fine 10 and suspension or revocation of the license for the violation.
- 11 **[(g)] (H)** Title 4, Subtitle 2 of this article does not apply to this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
