COMMENDING CORPORAL TOLIVER AND OFFICER LEONARD OF THE IRONDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT AS NOMINEES FOR THE 2017 ALABAMA LEGISLATIVE MEDAL OF HONOR FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT.

WHEREAS, it is with highest commendation that we recognize Corporal Toliver and Officer Leonard of the Irondale Police Department as nominees for the 2017 Alabama Legislative Medal of Honor for Law Enforcement, Alabama's highest law enforcement award for extraordinary courage in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2016, Corporal Toliver responded to a call reporting a suspect looking into vehicles in a shopping center parking lot and pulling on door handles; Corporal Toliver located the suspect and began talking to him; the suspect ran and jumped in his vehicle and attempted to flee; Officer Leonard, who had also responded to the call, reached through the suspect's vehicle window in an attempt to grab the keys out of the ignition; the suspect accelerated his vehicle dragging Officer Leonard across the parking lot; Officer Leonard rolled out of the path of the car and avoided being run over by the speeding vehicle; Corporal Toliver jumped into his vehicle and pursued the fleeing suspect; Officer Leonard joined Corporal Toliver in the pursuit through

Irondale and eventually into Birmingham city limits; the suspect eventually ran through a stop sign and struck another vehicle; the suspect crawled through the window of his incapacitated car and fled on foot; Corporal Toliver and Officer Leonard proceeded to chase the suspect on foot; they deployed their tasers causing the suspect to trip and fall; the suspect pulled a gun out of his waistband and pointed it at Corporal Toliver attempting to shoot him; both officers fired their duty weapons and shot the suspect, who died on the scene; and

WHEREAS, placed in a life-threatening situation and without a moment's hesitation, Officer Toliver and Officer Leonard placed themselves in the line of peril and stopped an individual, who proved to be a danger to the public and showed he would do anything to avoid apprehension, from harming or killing anyone; and

WHEREAS, Officer Toliver and Officer Leonard demonstrated immense courage, diligence, and quick response in a life-threatening situation; their loyalty and unwavering commitment to protect and serve the residents of Irondale were evidenced through their willingness to make the quick and proper response in order to protect the lives of others; and

WHEREAS, Officer Toliver and Officer Leonard epitomize the qualities of those who serve and protect, and they are truly deserving of this distinguished nomination for
