A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Health and Human Services Transportation Improvement Act of 2023**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Rural Nonemergency Medical Transportation
4 Program; repealing a certain cap on the amount of grants that may be awarded by
5 the Maryland Transit Administration under the Maryland Senior Rides Program;
6 repealing a certain cap on funding for the Job Access and Reverse Commute Program
7 and requiring the Governor to provide funding for the Rural Nonemergency Medical
8 Transportation Program in the State budget; establishing the State Coordinating
9 Committee for Health and Human Services Transportation; and generally relating
10 to transportation for health and human services in the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Health – General

SUBTITLE 48. RURAL NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM.

13–4801.

(A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
INDICATED.

(B) “ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL” MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

(1) DOES NOT QUALIFY TO RECEIVE STATE OR FEDERAL FUNDING
FOR TRANSPORTATION RELATED TO RECEIVING MEDICAL SERVICES BECAUSE THE
INDIVIDUAL:

(I) RESIDES IN A LOCATION THAT DISQUALIFIES THE
INDIVIDUAL FROM QUALIFYING FOR THE FUNDING;

(II) OWNS A CAR;

(III) RECEIVED TRANSPORTATION FROM A VOLUNTEER, BUT
THE INDIVIDUAL NO LONGER HAS ACCESS TO THAT TRANSPORTATION;

(IV) HAD A MEDICAL PROCEDURE THAT DOES NOT QUALIFY THE
INDIVIDUAL FOR THE FUNDING;

(V) HAS A TEMPORARY DISABILITY THAT DOES NOT QUALIFY
THE INDIVIDUAL FOR THE FUNDING; OR

(VI) DOES NOT LIVE WITHIN THE REQUIRED DISTANCE OF A
PUBLIC BUS STOP TO QUALIFY THE INDIVIDUAL FOR THE FUNDING;

1 **(2) NEEDS TRANSPORTATION TO OR FROM MEDICAL SERVICES**
2 **WHERE EACH TRIP EITHER BEGINS OR ENDS IN A RURAL COUNTY; AND**

3 **(3) A HOSPITAL CARE COORDINATOR DETERMINES HAS A MEDICAL**
4 **NEED FOR WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL REQUIRES TRANSPORTATION SERVICES**
5 **THROUGH THE PROGRAM.**

6 **(C) “HOSPITAL” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 19–301 OF THIS ARTICLE.**

7 **(D) “HOSPITAL CARE COORDINATOR” MEANS AN EMPLOYEE OF A HOSPITAL**
8 **WHO COORDINATES TRANSPORTATION RELATED TO MEDICAL SERVICES FOR**
9 **ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE.**

10 **(E) “NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION” MEANS AN ORGANIZATION THAT:**

11 **(1) Is:**

12 **(I) DESCRIBED IN § 501(C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE**
13 **CODE; AND**

14 **(II) EXEMPT FROM INCOME TAX UNDER § 501(A) OF THE**
15 **INTERNAL REVENUE CODE; AND**

16 **(2) PROVIDES TRANSPORTATION SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE**
17 **INDIVIDUALS THROUGH A PROGRAM ADOPTED BY A HOSPITAL.**

18 **(F) “PROGRAM” MEANS THE RURAL NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL**
19 **TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM.**

20 **(G) “RURAL COUNTY” MEANS:**

21 **(1) ALLEGANY COUNTY;**

13-4802.

(A) THERE IS A RURAL NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM.

(B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS FOR HOSPITALS TO COORDINATE TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED BY A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO OR FROM MEDICAL SERVICES FOR ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.

13-4803.

(A) A PROGRAM ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE SHALL:

(1) COORDINATE TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED BY A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION FOR AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL TO TRAVEL TO OR FROM MEDICAL SERVICES;

1 (2) INCLUDE A MONTHLY BUDGET SET BY EACH NONPROFIT
2 ORGANIZATION PARTICIPATING IN A PROGRAM ADOPTED BY A HOSPITAL
3 ESTABLISHING THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES THE
4 ORGANIZATION WILL PROVIDE TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE PATIENTS AT
5 THE HOSPITAL THROUGH THE PROGRAM; AND

6 (3) PROVIDE INFORMATION TO A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION ABOUT
7 ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS THAT THE CARE COORDINATOR HAS SELECTED TO RECEIVE
8 TRANSPORTATION SERVICES THROUGH THE PROGRAM IN A MANNER THAT
9 COMPLIES WITH STATE AND FEDERAL PRIVACY LAWS.

10 (B) A PROGRAM MAY NOT PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION:

11 (1) TO AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL FOR MORE THAN 120 DAYS AT A
12 TIME; OR

13 (2) TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO REQUESTS TRANSPORTATION BUT DOES
14 NOT USE THE TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED ON MORE THAN ONE OCCASION.

16 (A) A HOSPITAL MAY ADOPT A PROGRAM IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS
17 SUBTITLE.

18 (B) IF A HOSPITAL ADOPTS A PROGRAM, THE HOSPITAL SHALL:

19 (1) CONTRACT WITH A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO PROVIDE
20 TRANSPORTATION TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE PATIENTS AT THE HOSPITAL
21 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE; AND

22 (2) ESTABLISH AND ADOPT A PROCESS OF NOTIFYING PATIENTS AT
23 THE HOSPITAL ABOUT SERVICES AVAILABLE THROUGH THE PROGRAM.

24 (C) A HOSPITAL CARE COORDINATOR SHALL:

25 (1) DETERMINE WHICH PATIENTS OF THE HOSPITAL WHO ARE
26 INTERESTED IN RECEIVING TRANSPORTATION SERVICES THROUGH THE PROGRAM
27 ARE ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS;

28 (2) DETERMINE WHICH ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS WILL RECEIVE
29 TRANSPORTATION THROUGH THE PROGRAM IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BUDGET
30 PROVIDED BY THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION; AND

(3) COORDINATE TRANSPORTATION FOR AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL WHO THE HOSPITAL CARE COORDINATOR SELECTS TO RECEIVE TRANSPORTATION TO TRAVEL TO AND FROM RECEIVING MEDICAL SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE.

(D) IF A HOSPITAL ENTERS INTO A CONTRACT WITH A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROVIDING TRANSPORTATION THROUGH THE PROGRAM, A HOSPITAL SHALL REPORT THE NAME AND CONTACT INFORMATION OF THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO THE DEPARTMENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE ON WHICH THE CONTRACT IS SIGNED.

13-4805.

(A) IN FISCAL YEAR 2025 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF AT LEAST \$1,000,000 TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF CARRYING OUT THIS SUBTITLE.

(B) EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION:

(1) TO EACH NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES SERVICES THROUGH THE PROGRAM, AS REPORTED UNDER § 13-4804(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

(2) IN AN AMOUNT PROPORTIONAL TO THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION'S ESTIMATED ANNUAL BUDGET FOR PROVIDING TRANSPORTATION UNDER THE PROGRAM.

Article – Transportation

7-1002.

(a) There is a Maryland Senior Rides Program in the Administration.

(b) The purpose of the Program is to encourage regional providers to provide door-to-door transportation for low-income to moderate-income seniors.

(c) The Administration shall award grants to qualified Program applicants, as provided in § 7-1003 of this subtitle, for the operation of transportation services as specified in this section.

(d) To be eligible for a grant under § 7-1003 of this subtitle, a Program applicant shall:

(1) Provide door-to-door transportation for low-income to moderate-income seniors who have difficulty accessing or using other existing transportation systems;

(2) Use primarily volunteer drivers who drive their own vehicles;

(3) Use a dispatcher system to respond quickly to requests from low-income to moderate-income seniors for door-to-door transportation; and

(4) Define a geographic area for which door-to-door transportation is provided.

(e) A Program participant may provide door-to-door transportation to an eligible senior who does not reside in the geographic area defined by the Program participant under subsection (d)(4) of this section when applying to participate in the Program, so long as service is not diminished to an eligible senior who does reside in the defined geographic area.

(f) A Program participant shall expend a matching fund of at least 25% of the total capital or operating costs associated with providing door-to-door transportation for low-income to moderate-income seniors.

(g) [The Administration may not award more than \$500,000 in grants per year.

(h)] A Program participant may charge reasonable fees for door-to-door transportation provided by the Program participant.

[(i)] (H) Nothing in this section prohibits a Program participant from providing services in addition to those described in subsection (d) of this section.

There is a Job Access and Reverse Commute Program in the Administration.

[7-1107.

Funds for the Program shall be as provided by the Governor in the State budget, not to exceed \$400,000 annually.]

THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROGRAM IN THE STATE BUDGET.

7-1109.

(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(2) "STATE AGENCY" MEANS AN EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, OR OFFICE OF THE STATE.

(3) "TRANSPORTATION-DISADVANTAGED" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO QUALIFIES FOR FEDERALLY CONDUCTED OR FEDERALLY ASSISTED TRANSPORTATION-RELATED PROGRAMS OR SERVICES, AS IMPLEMENTED AND COORDINATED BY A STATE AGENCY, DUE TO DISABILITY, INCOME, OR ADVANCED AGE.

(B) THERE IS A STATE COORDINATING COMMITTEE FOR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION.

(C) THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

(1) THE SECRETARY, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(2) THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN SERVICES, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(3) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(4) THE SECRETARY OF AGING, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(5) THE SECRETARY OF DISABILITIES, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(6) THE SECRETARY OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(7) THE SECRETARY OF PLANNING, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(8) THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(9) THE SECRETARY OF LABOR, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

(10) THE DIRECTOR OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE FOR THE DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

1 (11) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND
2 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES COUNCIL, OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S
3 DESIGNEE;

4 (12) THE EXECUTIVE BOARD CHAIR OF THE RURAL MARYLAND
5 COUNCIL, OR THE EXECUTIVE BOARD CHAIR'S DESIGNEE; AND

6 (13) ANY ADDITIONAL MEMBERS RECOMMENDED BY THE CHAIR OF
7 THE COMMITTEE AND APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR TO PROVIDE INPUT FROM
8 LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, EMPLOYERS, AGENCIES, AND ORGANIZATIONS SERVING
9 PRIORITY POPULATIONS, TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS, AND CONSUMERS FROM
10 PRIORITY POPULATIONS.

11 (D) (1) THE APPOINTED MEMBERS SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE
12 GOVERNOR.

13 (2) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.

14 (3) THE GOVERNOR MAY STAGGER THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED
15 MEMBERS.

16 (E) THE SECRETARY, OR THE DESIGNEE OF THE SECRETARY, SHALL CHAIR
17 THE COMMITTEE.

18 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMITTEE.

19 (G) A MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE:

20 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE
21 COMMITTEE; BUT

22 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
23 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

24 (H) THE COMMITTEE SHALL:

25 (1) EXAMINE THE TRANSPORTATION NEEDS OF RESIDENTS OF THE
26 STATE WHO:

27 (I) ARE ELDERLY;

28 (II) HAVE A DISABILITY; OR

1 (III) REQUIRE TRANSPORTATION TO ACCESS JOBS, MEDICAL
2 AND OTHER HEALTH-RELATED APPOINTMENTS, SENIOR CITIZEN PROGRAMS, OR
3 OTHER PROGRAMS REQUIRING THE TRANSPORTATION OF INDIVIDUALS WHO
4 QUALIFY AS TRANSPORTATION-DISADVANTAGED;

5 (2) COORDINATE EFFORTS IN THE STATE TO PROVIDE QUALITY
6 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION SERVICES BY WORKING WITH
7 APPROPRIATE FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL AGENCIES, TRANSIT CONSUMERS, AND
8 TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS, TO DEVELOP A COOPERATIVE AND COORDINATED
9 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM;

10 (3) CONDUCT AN INVENTORY AND ASSESSMENT OF HEALTH AND
11 HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS IN THE STATE;

12 (4) DEVISE A 5-YEAR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
13 TRANSPORTATION PLAN THAT SETS GOALS AND OBJECTIVES TO HELP
14 TRANSPORTATION-DISADVANTAGED RESIDENTS OF THE STATE ACCESS JOBS,
15 EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS, HEALTH CARE SERVICES, AND OTHER
16 ACTIVITIES BY PROVIDING COST-EFFECTIVE, AFFORDABLE, HIGH-CAPACITY,
17 HIGH-QUALITY, EASILY UNDERSTOOD, AND SAFE AND ACCESSIBLE
18 TRANSPORTATION; AND

19 (5) (I) SERVE AS THE CLEARINGHOUSE FOR HEALTH AND HUMAN
20 SERVICES TRANSPORTATION COORDINATION ISSUES IN THE STATE;

21 (II) IDENTIFY AND FACILITATE RESOLUTION TO ISSUES
22 REGARDING HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION, BOTH LOCALLY AND
23 STATEWIDE;

24 (III) PARTICIPATE IN THE IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL
25 ALLOCATIONS OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION RESOURCES
26 DURING EMERGENCY EVACUATIONS;

27 (IV) EVALUATE COST-SAVING MEASURES;

28 (V) INVESTIGATE THE NEED FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
29 STANDARDS FOR VEHICLES AND DRIVERS WITHIN HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
30 TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS; AND

31 (VI) EXAMINE OTHER APPROPRIATE AREAS TO FACILITATE THE
32 DEVELOPMENT OF A QUALITY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION
33 SYSTEM IN THE STATE.

1 **(I) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COMMITTEE SHALL**
2 **REPORT ON ITS ACTIVITIES TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257**
3 **OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.**

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2023.
