JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of years an individual may serve as a Member of Congress.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Section 1. An individual may not serve as a Sen
3	ator or a Member of the House of Representatives if the
4	period of the individual's service as a Senator or Member
5	of the House of Representatives (or, in the case of an indi
6	vidual who has served as both a Senator and as a Member
7	of the House of Representatives, the combined period of
8	the individual's service as a Senator and Member of the
9	House of Representatives) exceeds 12 years.
10	"Section 2. No period occurring before the date of
11	the ratification of this article shall be taken into accoun-
12	in determining the period of an individual's service under
13	this article.".
