Prince George's County – Human Services – Family Connects Home Visiting Pilot Program

FOR the purpose of establishing the Family Connects Home Visiting Pilot Program in 4 5 Prince George's County; providing for the purpose of the Program; authorizing the 6 Program to provide certain services; requiring the Prince George's County 7 Department of Family Services, in consultation with a certain entity, to begin the 8 selection of certain participants in the Program on or before a certain date, provide 9 certain services, and study certain matters; authorizing the Prince George's County Department of Family Services to implement certain policies and procedures and 10 11 develop a certain process and certain partnerships; requiring the Governor, for a 12 certain fiscal year, to include in the State budget a certain appropriation for the 13 administration of the Program; requiring the Prince George's County Department of 14 Family Services to attempt to access certain federal funds; requiring the Prince 15 George's County Department of Family Services to report certain information on the 16 Program to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date: 17 defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Family Connects Home Visiting Pilot Program in Prince George's 18 19 County.

are residents of Prince George's County, and only 55% of births in Prince George's County are to women receiving first trimester prenatal care; and

WHEREAS, Research clearly shows that the earliest months of life are foundational for later social, emotional, and brain development; the physical and mental health of parents plays a critical role in this development; and when families and newborn infants have unmet needs, this often results in poor outcomes for children; and

WHEREAS, Family Connects International is an evidence-based home visiting model developed by Duke University combining engagement and alignment of community services providers with short-term home visiting by registered nurses, beginning in the first month after birth; and

WHEREAS, The goal of Family Connects International is to support families and infants in the critical first months following birth with services that reflect their needs and preferences and that advance the well–being of all; and

WHEREAS, Providing parents with information and support during the transition to parenthood and early childhood is an effective strategy for achieving greater health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, The Prince George's County Department of Family Services is committed to improving healthy child and family development through intensive prenatal support, mentoring, and in-home visits for women living in Prince George's County; therefore, the Department is willing to administer and monitor the Family Connects Home Visiting Pilot Program; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 (3) A RECOMMENDATION ON WHETHER THE PROGRAM SHOULD BE 16 EXTENDED OR EXPANDED.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
