25	with the State designated exchange, and protecting data privacy;
26	(3) how to enhance the coordination of health care services for individuals
27	with sickle cell disease who are transitioning from pediatric to adult health care in the
28	State including the identification of available resources for individuals who are
29	transitioning; and
30	(4) how to engage with community-based health fairs and other
31	community-sponsored events in areas with a statistically high number of individuals with
32	sickle cell disease to provide outreach and education on living with sickle cell disease and
33	how to access health care services.
