BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Business Regulation Section 15-201 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) BY adding to Article – Business Regulation Section 15–209 and 15–210 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
