1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Services – Commissioner’s Duties – Staffing Report**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Commissioner of Correction to submit a certain security
4 and staffing report to the Secretary of Public Safety, the Governor, and the General
5 Assembly at a certain time; requiring the report to be based on a certain survey;
6 requiring the report to include certain information; and generally relating to the
7 duties of the Commissioner of Correction.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Correctional Services**

16 **3–207.1.**

17 **(A) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 31, 2017, AND ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 31 IN**
18 **EVERY ODD–NUMBERED YEAR THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL SUBMIT A**

1 SECURITY AND STAFFING REPORT COVERING THE PRIOR 2-YEAR PERIOD TO THE
2 SECRETARY, THE GOVERNOR, AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
3 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

4 (B) THE REPORT SHALL BE BASED ON A JOINT SURVEY CONDUCTED BY THE
5 ADMINISTRATION OF THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION AND THE EXCLUSIVE
6 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING REPRESENTATIVE OF THE EMPLOYEES.

7 (C) THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:

8 (1) A POST-BY-POST ANALYSIS THAT IDENTIFIES THE ACTUAL
9 NUMBER OF POSITIONS NEEDED TO SAFELY AND SECURELY STAFF EACH
10 INSTITUTION;

11 (2) THE AMOUNT OF OVERTIME CURRENTLY BEING USED TO MEET
12 MINIMUM STANDARDS;

13 (3) AN ACCOUNTING OF ALL INSTITUTION ACTIVITIES THAT HAVE
14 BEEN IMPACTED BY STAFFING LEVELS;

15 (4) AN ASSESSMENT OF EXPECTED FUTURE TURNOVER IN
16 PERSONNEL; AND

17 (5) AN ANALYSIS OF THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL STAFF.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 2017.
