A BILL

To prohibit the use of funds to provide for the United States to become a party to the Paris Agreement.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "No Taxpayer Funding
- 5 for Paris Climate Agreement Act".

1 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS TO PROVIDE FOR

- 2 THE UNITED STATES TO BECOME A PARTY TO
- 3 THE PARIS AGREEMENT.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 5 sion of law, no funds are authorized to be appropriated,
- 6 obligated, or expended to take any action to provide for
- 7 the United States to become a party to the Paris Agree-
- 8 ment.
- 9 (b) Paris Agreement Defined.—In this section,
- 10 the term "Paris Agreement" means the decision by the
- 11 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate
- 12 Change's 21st Conference of Parties in Paris, France,
- 13 adopted December 12, 2015.
