# H. R. 6125

To direct the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Affairs to coordinate support for survivors of sexual trauma.

Ms. Speier (for herself, Ms. Brownley of California, Mr. Pappas, Mr. Cohen, Mr. McGovern, Mr. Danny K. Davis of Illinois, Mr. Defazio, and Ms. Norton) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

## A BILL

To direct the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Affairs to coordinate support for survivors of sexual trauma.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Supporting Survivors
- 5 of Military Sexual Trauma Act of 2020".

1	SEC. 2. COORDINATION OF SUPPORT FOR SURVIVORS OF
2	SEXUAL TRAUMA.
3	(a) In General.—Not later than one year after the
4	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretaries of De-
5	fense and Veterans Affairs shall jointly develop, imple-
6	ment, and maintain a standard of coordinated care for
7	members of the Armed Forces who are survivors of sexual
8	trauma. Such standard shall include the following:
9	(b) MINIMUM ELEMENTS.—The standard developed
0	and implemented under subsection (a) by the Secretaries
1	of Defense and Veterans Affairs shall include the fol-
2	lowing:
3	(1) Information for members of the
4	ARMED FORCES.—The Secretary of Defense shall en-
5	sure that—
6	(A) information is posted in each facility of
7	the Department of Defense regarding services
8	furnished by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs
9	to survivors of sexual trauma; and
20	(B) Sexual Assault Response Coordinators
21	and Uniformed Victim Advocates receive annual
22	training on resources of the Department of Vet-
23	erans Affairs regarding sexual trauma.
24	(2) Coordination between staff of the
25	DEPARTMENTS.—The Secretaries shall ensure that a
26	Sexual Assault Response Coordinator or Uniformed

Victim Advocate of the Department of Defense who receives a report of an instance of sexual trauma connects each survivor to the Military Sexual Trauma Coordinator of the Department of Veterans Affairs at the facility of that Department nearest to the residence of that survivor.

- (1) REPORT ON RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT.—
  Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Affairs shall provide a report to the appropriate committees of Congress regarding the availability of residential treatment programs for survivors of sexual trauma, including—
- 15 (A) barriers to access for such programs; 16 and
- 17 (B) resources required to reduce such bar-18 riers.
  - (2) Initial Report.—Upon implementation of the standard under subsection (a), the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Affairs shall jointly submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a report on the standard.
- (3) PROGRESS REPORTS.—Not later than 180
   days after submitting the initial report under para-

1	graph (2), and on December 1 of each subsequent
2	year, the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Af-
3	fairs shall jointly submit to the appropriate commit-
4	tees of Congress a report on the progress of the Sec-
5	retaries in implementing and improving the stand-
6	ard.
7	(4) Updates.—Whenever the Secretaries of
8	Defense and Veterans Affairs update the standard
9	developed under subsection (a), the Secretaries shall
10	jointly submit to the appropriate committees of Con-
11	gress a report on such update, including a com-
12	prehensive and detailed description of such update
13	and the reasons for such update.
14	(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:
15	(1) The term "sexual trauma" means psycho-
16	logical trauma described in section $1720D(a)(1)$ of
17	title 38, United States Code.
18	(2) The term "appropriate committees of Con-
19	gress' means—
20	(A) the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of
21	the House of Representatives and the Senate;
22	and
23	(B) the Committees on Armed Services of

the House of Representatives and the Senate.
