Resolved, That the bill from the Senate (S. 3662) entitled "An Act to temporarily increase the cost share authority for aqueous film forming foam input-based testing equipment, and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENT:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

7	(a) In General.—Section 47109 of title 49, United				
8	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following				
9	new subsection:				
10	"(g) Special Rule for Covered Equipment.—				
11	"(1) In general.—The Government's share of				
12	allowable project costs for covered equipment and its				
13	installation shall be 100 percent.				
14	"(2) Definition of covered equipment.—For				
15	purposes of this subsection, the term 'covered equip-				

- ment' means aqueous film forming foam input-based 1 2 testing equipment that is eligible for Airport Improvement Program funding based on Federal Aviation 3 4 Administration PGL 21-01, titled Extension of Eli-5 gibility for stand-alone acquisition of input-based 6 testing equipment and truck modification', dated Oc-7 tober 5, 2021 (or any other successor program guid-8 ance letter). 9 "(3) Sunset.—The higher cost share authority 10 established in this subsection shall terminate on the 11 earlier of— 12 "(A) 180 days after the date on which the 13 eligibility of covered equipment for Airport Im-14 provement Program funding under the authority 15 described in paragraph (2) terminates or is dis-16 continued by the Administrator; or 17 "(B) 5 years after the date of enactment of
- 19 (b) Outreach Efforts.—Not later than 90 days 20 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator 21 of the Federal Aviation Administration shall conduct an 22 outreach effort to make airports aware of the higher cost 23 share authority established in section 47109(g) of title 49, 24 United States Code, as added by subsection (a).

2	MENTS.—Not later than 18 months after the date of enact-					
3	ment of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal Aviation					
4	Administration shall provide a briefing to the Committee					
5	on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate					
6	and the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure					
7	of the House of Representatives that reviews—					
8	(1) potential options for Congress to reimburse					
9	airports that—					
10	(A) are certificated under part 139 of title					
11	14, Code of Federal Regulations; and					
12	(B) acquired covered equipment (as defined					
13	in section 47109(g) of title 49, United States					
14	Code) as added by subsection (a)—					
15	(i) with Federal funding but with a					
16	Government's share less than 100 percent;					
17	or					
18	(ii) without Federal funding;					
19	(2) information relevant to estimating the poten-					
20	tial cost of providing such reimbursement;					
21	(3) the status of the Federal Aviation Adminis-					
22	tration's outreach efforts as required under subsection
