Mr. Rubio (for himself and Mr. Cornyn) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to strengthen the National Disaster Medical System, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Strengthening the Na-
- 5 tional Disaster Medical System Act of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL DISASTER MEDICAL SYSTEM.
- 7 (a) Strengthening the National Disaster
- 8 Medical System.—Clause (ii) of section 2812(a)(3)(A)
- 9 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300hh-
- 10 11(a)(3)(A)) is amended to read as follows:

1	"(ii) be present at locations, and for
2	limited periods of time, specified by the
3	Secretary on the basis that the Secretary
4	has determined that a location is at risk of
5	a public health emergency during the time
6	specified, or there is a significant potential
7	for a public health emergency.".
8	(b) REVIEW OF THE NATIONAL DISASTER MEDICAL
9	System.—Section 2812(b)(2) of the Public Health Serv-
10	ice Act (42 U.S.C. $300\text{hh}-11(\text{b})(2)$) is amended to read
11	as follows:
12	"(2) Joint Review and Medical Surge Ca-
13	PACITY STRATEGIC PLAN.—
14	"(A) Review.—Not later than 180 days
15	after the date of enactment of the Strength-
16	ening the National Disaster Medical System
17	Act of 2019, the Secretary, in coordination with
18	the Secretary of Homeland Security, the Sec-
19	retary of Defense, and the Secretary of Vet-
20	erans Affairs, shall conduct a joint review of
21	the National Disaster Medical System. Such re-
22	view shall include—
23	"(i) an evaluation of medical surge ca-
24	pacity, as described in section 2803(a):

1	"(ii) an assessment of the available
2	workforce of the intermittent disaster re-
3	sponse personnel described in subsection
4	(e);
5	"(iii) the capacity of the workforce de-
6	scribed in clause (ii) to respond to all haz-
7	ards, including the capacity to simulta-
8	neously respond to multiple public health
9	emergencies and the capacity to respond to
10	a nationwide public health emergency;
11	"(iv) the effectiveness of efforts to re-
12	cruit, retain, and train such workforce; and
13	"(v) gaps that may exist in such
14	workforce and recommendations for ad-
15	dressing such gaps.
16	"(B) UPDATES.—As part of the National
17	Health Security Strategy under section 2802,
18	the Secretary shall update the findings from the
19	review under subparagraph (A) and provide rec-
20	ommendations to modify the policies of the Na-
21	tional Disaster Medical System as necessary.".
22	(c) Notification of Shortage.—Section 2812(c)
23	of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300hh–11(c))
24	is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(3) NOTIFICATION.—Not later than 30 days after the date on which the Secretary determines the number of intermittent disaster-response personnel of the National Disaster Medical System is insuffi-cient to address a public health emergency or poten-tial public health emergency, the Secretary shall sub-mit to the congressional committees of jurisdiction a notification detailing—

- "(A) the impact such shortage could have on meeting public health needs and emergency medical personnel needs during a public health emergency; and
- "(B) any identified measures to address such shortage.

"(4) CERTAIN APPOINTMENTS.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—If the Secretary determines that the number of intermittent disaster response personnel within the National Disaster Medical System under this section is insufficient to address a public health emergency or potential public health emergency, the Secretary may appoint candidates directly to personnel positions for intermittent disaster response within such system without regard to the provisions of sections 3309 through 3318 of title 5,

United States Code. The Secretary shall provide
updates on the number of vacant or unfilled positions within such system to the congressional
committees of jurisdiction each quarter for
which this authority is in effect.

"(B) SUNSET.—The authority under this

"(B) SUNSET.—The authority under this paragraph shall expire on September 30, 2022.".
