- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Howard County Task Force to Study Revenue Options 5 for School Capital Needs to identify capital needs of Howard County Public Schools 6 and study options for closing any identified funding gaps; requiring the Howard 7 County Council to submit a resolution to the Howard County Delegation if the 8 Howard County Council determines a recommendation from the Task Force should 9 be enacted but the Council lacks the authority to enact the recommendation; and 10 generally relating to a Howard County Task Force to Study Revenue Options for School Capital Needs. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That:

- 14 (a) There is a Howard County Task Force to Study Revenue Options for School 15 Capital Needs.
- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the Chair of the 18 Howard County Senate Delegation;

5	(c) The County Executive shall designate the chair of the Task Force.
6	(d) The County Executive shall provide staff for the Task Force.
7 8	(e) A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force.
9 10	(f) In consultation with Howard County Public Schools, the Howard County Department of Finance, and the Howard County Budget Office, the Task Force shall:
11 12	(1) identify the capital needs, including deferred maintenance, of Howard County Public Schools through 2035;
13 14	(2) determine the projected funding expected to be allocated to Howard County Public Schools capital projects through 2035;
15 16	(3) identify the anticipated funding gaps for Howard County Public Schools capital projections under current revenue projections through 2035; and
17 18	(4) study options for closing any identified funding gaps for Howard County Public Schools capital projects under current revenue projections through 2035, including:
19 20	(i) allocating a higher percentage of revenue from the transfer tax to Howard County Public Schools capital projects;
21	(ii) enacting a commercial excise tax;
22 23	(iii) exercising existing authority the County may use to generate additional revenue; and
24 25	(iv) studying any other potential revenue sources the Task Force determines appropriate.
26 27	(g) On or before December 1, 2025 October 31, 2024, the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to:
28	(1) the Howard County Executive;

(h) If the Howard County Council determines a recommendation included in report submitted under subsection (g) of this section should be enacted but the Council County lack the authority to enact the recommendation, the Howard County Council should be resolution requesting the Howard County Delegation to the General Assemble authorize the Howard County Council to enact the specified recommendation.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect Ju 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of Ju 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall abrogated and of no further force and effect.
