4 FOR the purpose of providing that real property owned by a religious group or organization
5 that is leased to a third party does not qualify for a certain property tax exemption;
6 and generally relating to an exemption from the property tax for property owned by
7 a religious group or organization.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Tax – Property**

16 7–204.

17 **(A)** Subject to **SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION AND § 7–204.1** of this subtitle,
18 property that is owned by a religious group or organization is not subject to property tax if
19 the property is actually used exclusively for:

(1) public religious worship;

(2) a parsonage or convent; or

(3) educational purposes.

(B) (1) REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY A RELIGIOUS GROUP OR ORGANIZATION THAT IS LEASED TO A THIRD PARTY DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR THE EXEMPTION UNDER THIS SECTION.

(2) IF ONLY PART OF THE REAL PROPERTY IS LEASED TO A THIRD PARTY, ONLY THAT PART SO LEASED DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR THE EXEMPTION UNDER THIS SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2022, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 2022.
