A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to ensure that bonds used to finance professional stadiums are not treated as tax-exempt bonds.

- 3 SECTION 1. NO TAX-EXEMPT BONDS FOR PROFESSIONAL
- 4 STADIUMS.
- 5 (a) In General.—Section 103(b) of the Internal
- 6 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end
- 7 the following new paragraph:
- 8 "(4) Professional Stadium Bond.—Any pro-
- 9 fessional stadium bond.".

- 1 (b) Professional Stadium Bond Defined.—Sec-
- 2 tion 103(c) of such Code is amended by adding at the end
- 3 the following new paragraph:
- 4 "(3) Professional Stadium Bond.—The
- 5 term 'professional stadium bond' means any bond
- 6 issued as part of an issue any proceeds of which are
- 7 used to finance or refinance capital expenditures al-
- 8 locable to a facility (or appurtenant real property)
- 9 which, during at least 5 days during any calendar
- 10 year, is used as a stadium or arena for professional
- sports exhibitions, games, or training.".
- (c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 13 this section shall apply to bonds issued after the date of
- 14 the enactment of this Act.

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
