A BILL

To ensure that the Federal Communications Commission does not approve radio frequency devices that pose a national security risk.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Secure Equipment Act
- 5 of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. UPDATES TO EQUIPMENT AUTHORIZATION PROC-
- 7 ESS OF FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COM-
- 8 MISSION.
- 9 (a) Rulemaking.—

- (1) In general.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall conclude a rulemaking proceeding, in accordance with paragraph (2), to update the equipment authorization procedures of the Commission.
 - (2) UPDATES REQUIRED.—In the rulemaking proceeding conducted under paragraph (1), the Commission shall clarify that the Commission will no longer review or approve any application for equipment authorization for equipment that is on the list of covered communications equipment or services published by the Commission under section 2(a) of the Secure and Trusted Communications Networks Act of 2019 (47 U.S.C. 1601(a)).
- 15 (b) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "Com-16 mission" means the Federal Communications Commission.
