A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve the recruitment of physicians in the Department of Veterans Affairs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Get Veterans a Doctor
- 5 Now Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. RECRUITMENT OF PHYSICIANS IN DEPARTMENT OF
- 7 VETERANS AFFAIRS.
- 8 (a) In General.—Section 7402(b)(1) of title 38,
- 9 United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) by inserting "or to be offered a contingent
2	appointment to such position," after "position,"; and
3	(2) by striking subparagraph (B) and inserting
4	the following new subparagraph (B):
5	"(B)(i) have completed a residency program
6	satisfactory to the Secretary; or
7	"(ii) with respect to an offer for a contingent
8	appointment upon the completion of a post-graduate
9	training program, complete such a residency pro-
10	gram by not later than two years after the date of
11	such offer; and".
12	(b) Oversight of Graduate Medical Education
13	Programs.—The Secretary shall—
14	(1) ensure that a recruiter or other similar offi-
15	cial of each Veterans Integrated Service Network
16	visits, not less than annually, each allopathic and os-
17	teopathic teaching institution with a graduate med-
18	ical education program within the Network to re-
19	cruit individuals to be appointed to positions in the
20	Veterans Health Administration; and
21	(2) submit to Congress an annual report on the
22	implementation of paragraph (1), including the suc-
23	cess of such recruiting efforts.
