1 and liquor license that the applicant holds. 2 Before the Board may issue the permit: (5)3 (i) the applicant shall complete the form that the Board provides; 4 and 5 (ii) the same advertising, posting of notice, and public hearing 6 requirements as those for Class B licenses shall be met. 7 (6)Off-sale alcoholic beverages receipts collected under the permit shall 8 be included in the calculation of average daily receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages 9 in a restaurant under § 1–101 of this article. 10 A holder of the permit may exercise the privileges of the permit only 11 when the licensed premises is open for business as a restaurant. 12 (8)The Board may adopt regulations to carry out this subsection, including 13 a limit on the number of permits to be issued. 14 (D) **(1)** THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY NOT DISPLAY OR PROVIDE SHELVING FOR BEER, WINE, OR LIQUOR FOR OFF-PREMISES SALES IN AREAS OF THE 15 16 ESTABLISHMENT THAT ARE ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC. 17 **(2)** OFF-SALE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES RECEIPTS COLLECTED 18 UNDER THE LICENSE SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE CALCULATION OF AVERAGE DAILY 19 RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN A RESTAURANT UNDER § 20 1–101 OF THIS ARTICLE. 21THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY SELL BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR 22 OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION ONLY WHEN THE LICENSED PREMISES IS OPEN FOR 23 BUSINESS AS A HOTEL OR RESTAURANT. 24 The Comptroller may issue one Class 8 farm brewery license and one Class 7 25micro-brewery license to a license holder that holds not more than five Class B and six 26 Class BLX beer, wine, and liquor licenses. 27 (f) The annual license fees are: 28(1) \$1,000 for the Class B beer, wine, and liquor license; and 29 (2) \$500 for the off-sale beer and wine permit FEE IS \$1,000. 30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
