Mr. MORAN (for himself, Mr. GARDNER, Mr. RISCH, Mr. THUNE, Mr.
LANKFORD, Mr. DAINES, and Mr. ROUNDS) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs

A BILL

To clarify the rights of Indians and Indian Tribes on Indian
lands under the National Labor Relations Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tribal Labor Sov-
5 ereignty Act of 2019”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF EMPLOYER.**

7 Section 2 of the National Labor Relations Act (29
8 U.S.C. 152) is amended—

9 (1) in paragraph (2), by inserting “or any In-
10 dian Tribe, or any enterprise or institution owned

1 and operated by an Indian Tribe and located on its
2 Indian lands,” after “subdivision thereof,”; and

3 (2) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(15) The term ‘Indian Tribe’ means any Indian
5 Tribe, band, nation, pueblo, or other organized group or
6 community which is recognized as eligible for the special
7 programs and services provided by the United States to
8 Indians because of their status as Indians.

9 “(16) The term ‘Indian’ means any individual who
10 is a member of an Indian Tribe.

11 “(17) The term ‘Indian lands’ means—

12 “(A) all lands within the limits of any Indian
13 reservation;

14 “(B) any lands title to which is either held in
15 trust by the United States for the benefit of any In-
16 dian Tribe or Indian or held by any Indian Tribe or
17 Indian subject to restriction by the United States
18 against alienation; and

19 “(C) any lands in the State of Oklahoma that
20 are within the boundaries of a former reservation (as
21 defined by the Secretary of the Interior) of a feder-
22 ally recognized Indian Tribe.”.

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
