1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Transportation Authority – Vehicles Not Using Bridge – Toll 3 Prohibition Third Generation–Electronic Toll Collection System

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Maryland Transportation Authority from charging a 4 toll at a toll plaza adjacent to a bridge that is a transportation facilities project for a 5 6 vehicle that does not traverse the bridge; requiring the Authority to direct, by 7 physical traffic management measures, vehicles that do not traverse the bridge into 8 a toll-free lane through the toll plaza or construct a lane bypassing the toll plaza for 9 use by vehicles that do not traverse the bridge; and generally relating to tolls and Maryland Transportation Authority bridges requiring the Maryland Transportation 10 Authority, on or before a certain date each year, to submit a certain report to the 11 Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on certain matters related 12 13 to the Third Generation-Electronic Toll Collection System, including information related to efforts to review and analyze the location of certain toll plazas for certain 14 purposes; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 15 Third Generation-Electronic Toll Collection System. 16
