Mr. Merkley (for himself and Mr. Booker) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To prohibit the use of the poisons sodium fluoroacetate (known as "Compound 1080") and sodium cyanide for predator control.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Chemical Poisons Re-
- 5 duction Act of 2019" or "Canyon's Law".
- 6 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to restrict the use of the
- 8 poisons sodium fluoroacetate (known as "Compound

1	1080") and sodium cyanide to kill predatory animals due
2	to the risks posed by those poisons to—
3	(1) public safety;
4	(2) national security;
5	(3) the environment; and
6	(4) persons and other animals that come into
7	accidental contact with those poisons.
8	SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON USE OF CERTAIN POISONS FOR
9	PREDATOR CONTROL.
10	(a) Definition of Predator Control Device.—
11	In this section, the term "predator control device"
12	means—
13	(1) a dispenser designed to propel sodium
14	fluoroacetate or sodium cyanide when activated by
15	an animal;
16	(2) a livestock protection collar designed to re-
17	lease sodium fluoroacetate or sodium cyanide when
18	punctured by an animal;
19	(3) a gas cartridge or other pyrotechnic device
20	designed to emit sodium fluoroacetate or sodium cy-
21	anide fumes when activated by an animal; and
22	(4) any other means of dispensing sodium
23	fluoroacetate or sodium cyanide, including in the
24	form of capsules, for wildlife management or other
25	animal control purposes.

- 1 (b) Prohibition.—It shall be unlawful to use so-
- 2 dium fluoroacetate (known as "Compound 1080") or so-
- 3 dium cyanide in a predator control device.
- 4 (c) Penalty.—Any person that violates subsection
- 5 (b) shall be fined under title 18, United States Code, im-
- 6 prisoned for not more than 2 years, or both.
