A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Education - Advanced Courses - Automatic Enrollment

FOR the purpose of requiring that, beginning in a certain school year, a student who exceeds grade level standards on the Maryland School Assessment, is identified as gifted and talented, or has reached college and career ready benchmarks on certain standardized tests shall be automatically enrolled in an advanced course for the corresponding subject area or areas for the following semester or school year; requiring a county board to use universal screening to identify gifted and talented students for automatic enrollment in advanced courses; requiring a county board, beginning in a certain school year, to annually notify the parents and guardians of enrolled students of the automatic enrollment policy and process, the course offerings, and the benefits of enrolling in advanced courses; requiring the annual notification to be sent in the primary language of the recipients; requiring a county board, on or before a certain date each year, beginning in a certain year, to submit a report to the State Board of Education; providing for the contents of the report; requiring the State Department of Education, beginning in a certain school year, to collect and publish certain data related to enrollment in advanced courses; requiring the data to be disaggregated by certain categories; authorizing a parent or guardian of a student to provide written consent for the student to be excluded or removed from automatic enrollment in an advanced course; authorizing the State Board to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to enrollment in advanced courses in public schools in the State.
