A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic
4 Substances to study and make recommendations related to the use of natural
5 psychedelic substances; and generally relating to the Task Force on Responsible Use
6 of Natural Psychedelic Substances.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
8 That:

9 (a) (1) In this section, “natural psychedelic substances” means naturally
10 derived psilocybin, psilocin, dimethyltryptamine, and mescaline.

11 (2) “Natural psychedelic substances” does not include peyote.

12 (b) There is a Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances.

13 (c) The Task Force consists of the following members:

14 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland who shall be appointed by the
15 President of the Senate;

16 (2) one member of the House of Delegates who shall be appointed by the
17 Speaker of the House;

18 (3) the Secretary of Health, or the Secretary’s designee;

19 (4) the Secretary of Disabilities, or the Secretary’s designee;

20 (5) the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, or the Secretary’s designee;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

(6) the Director of the Maryland Cannabis Administration, or the Director's designee; and

(7) the following members, appointed by the Governor:

(i) one representative of the University System of Maryland, the Johns Hopkins University's Center for Psychedelic and Consciousness Research, or Sheppard Pratt;

(ii) one representative of a federally recognized Native American tribe in the State with experience in the religious and spiritual use of psychedelic substances;

(iii) one individual with expertise in behavioral health;

(iv) one individual with expertise in the treatment of substance use disorders;

(v) one individual with expertise in the treatment of chronic pain;

(vi) one individual with expertise in psychedelic-assisted psychotherapy;

(vii) one individual with expertise in psychedelic research;

(viii) one individual with expertise in access to care in underserved communities;

(ix) one individual with expertise in drug policy reform;

(x) one individual with expertise as a member of law enforcement; and

(xi) one individual who is a patient with conditions that can be treated with psychedelic substances.

(d) To the extent practicable, the membership of the Task Force shall reflect the socioeconomic, ethnic, and geographic diversity of the State.

(e) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Task Force.

(f) The Maryland Cannabis Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force.

(g) A member of the Task Force:

(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but

1 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
2 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

3 (h) The Task Force shall:

4 (1) study:

5 (i) existing laws, policies, and practices relating to the use of natural
6 psychedelic substances;

7 (ii) the best available science and data on public benefits of
8 responsible access to and use of natural psychedelic substances;

9 (iii) opportunities to maximize public benefits of responsible access to
10 and use of natural psychedelic substances;

11 (iv) the best available data on potential risks of access to and use of
12 natural psychedelic substances;

13 (v) opportunities to mitigate potential risks of access to and use of
14 natural psychedelic substances; and

15 (vi) barriers health care practitioners and facilitators may encounter
16 relating to natural psychedelic substances, including barriers relating to insurance,
17 restrictions by licensing and credentialing entities, zoning, advertising, and financial
18 services;

19 (2) make recommendations regarding any changes to State law, policy, and
20 practices needed to create a Maryland Natural Psychedelic Substance Access Program that
21 enables broad, equitable, and affordable access to psychedelic substances, including:

22 (i) permitting requirements, including requirements regarding
23 education and safety;

24 (ii) access to treatment and regulated support; and

25 (iii) production of natural psychedelic substances; and

26 (3) make recommendations to transition from criminalizing conduct
27 involving natural psychedelic substances, including:

28 (i) punishing with civil penalties nonviolent infractions involving
29 the planting, cultivating, purchasing, transporting, distributing, or possessing of or other
30 engagement with natural psychedelic substances;

31 (ii) expunging the records of Marylanders with convictions for
32 nonviolent criminal offenses relating to natural psychedelic substances; and

(iii) releasing Marylanders incarcerated for nonviolent criminal offenses relating to natural psychedelic substances.

(i) The Task Force may consult with experts and stakeholders in conducting its duties.

(j) On or before July 31, 2025, the Task Force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
