1 AN ACT concerning

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- Public and Nonpublic Schools Bronchodilator Availability and Use Policy
- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education and authorizing nonpublic
- 4 schools in the State to establish a policy to obtain, administer, and train certain
- 5 school nurses and other school personnel to administer in emergency situations
- 6 bronchodilators to a student who is determined to have asthma and is experiencing
- asthma-related symptoms or is perceived to be in respiratory distress by a school
- 8 nurse or any other school personnel; and generally relating to a bronchodilator
- 9 availability and use policy in public and nonpublic schools in the State.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (2) "ASTHMA" MEANS A CHRONIC LUNG DISEASE THAT INFLAMES
- 22 AND NARROWS AIR PASSAGES, CAUSING RECURRING PERIODS OF WHEEZING, CHEST
- 23 TIGHTNESS, SHORTNESS OF BREATH, AND COUGHING.

- 2 BRONCHIAL MUSCLES, RESULTING IN THE EXPANSION OF BRONCHIAL AIR
- 3 PASSAGES TO PROVIDE FAST TREATMENT OF ASTHMA-RELATED SYMPTOMS AND
- 4 SYMPTOMS OF RESPIRATORY DISTRESS.
- 5 (4) "SCHOOL PERSONNEL" MEANS INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE EMPLOYED
- 6 BY A PUBLIC SCHOOL, INCLUDING PART-TIME EMPLOYEES, TEACHERS AND
- 7 SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL FOR AT LEAST 7 DAYS EACH
- 8 SCHOOL YEAR, REGISTERED NURSE CASE MANAGERS, DELEGATING NURSES, AND

  - (3) THE PROPER FOLLOW-UP EMERGENCY PROCEDURES;

- 1 (4) A PROVISION AUTHORIZING A SCHOOL NURSE TO OBTAIN AND
- 2 STORE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY,
- 3 INCLUDING INHALERS WITH SPACERS, TO BE USED IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION;

- 5 (5) A REQUIREMENT THAT EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL DEVELOP AND

- 12 (2) Bronchodilators and modes of delivery, including
- 13 INHALERS WITH SPACERS, USED BY A SCHOOL NURSE OR ANY OTHER SCHOOL
- 14 PERSONNEL MUST BE FROM A LICENSED PHARMACY OR MANUFACTURER.
- 15 (3) A COUNTY BOARD OR PUBLIC SCHOOL MAY ACCEPT DONATED
- 16 BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING INHALERS WITH
- 17 SPACERS, FROM A LICENSED PHARMACY OR MANUFACTURER.
- 18 (4) A COUNTY BOARD MAY APPLY FOR GRANTS TO OBTAIN FUNDING
- 19 FOR THE PURCHASE OF BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING

- 21 (E) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, A SCHOOL

- 23 ASTHMA ATTACK OR RESPIRATORY DISTRESS OF A CHILD IN ACCORDANCE WITH

- 26 (F) (1) (I) FOR EACH INCIDENT AT THE SCHOOL OR AT A RELATED
- 27 SCHOOL EVENT THAT REQUIRED THE USE OF A BRONCHODILATOR, EACH PUBLIC

- 29 1. Notify the student's parent or legal
- 30 GUARDIAN OF THE INCIDENT; AND
- 31 **2.** Make a record of the incident, on the form
- 32 THAT THE DEPARTMENT REQUIRES, AND FILE THE FORM IN THE STUDENT'S SCHOOL
- 33 MEDICAL RECORD.

- 2 DEPARTMENT A REPORT, ON THE FORM AND SCHEDULE REQUIRED BY THE

- 4 SCHOOL EVENT THAT REQUIRED THE USE OF A BRONCHODILATOR.

- 6 STANDARD FORMS TO RECORD EACH INCIDENT AND REPORT INCIDENTS REQUIRING

- 4 AND HAS A PRESCRIPTION FOR A BRONCHODILATOR AS PRESCRIBED BY THE
- 5 STUDENT'S HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER.
- 6 (C) THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION 7 SHALL INCLUDE:
- 8 (1) TRAINING FOR SCHOOL NURSES AND OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL
- 9 ON HOW TO RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF ASTHMA AND RESPIRATORY
- 10 DISTRESS BY A LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER WHO IS AUTHORIZED TO
- 11 ADMINISTER A BRONCHODILATOR AND WHO HAS BEEN TRAINED IN AN ESTABLISHED
- 12 PROTOCOL ON HOW TO RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF ASTHMA AND
- 13 RESPIRATORY DISTRESS;
- 14 (2) PROCEDURES FOR THE EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATION OF A 15 BRONCHODILATOR;
- 16 (3) THE PROPER FOLLOW-UP EMERGENCY PROCEDURES;
- 17 (4) A PROVISION AUTHORIZING A SCHOOL NURSE OR ANY OTHER
- 18 LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER TO OBTAIN, AND A SCHOOL NURSE OR ANY
- 19 OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO STORE, AT A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL FOR USE IN AN
- 20 EMERGENCY SITUATION BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING
- 21 INHALERS WITH SPACERS;
- 22 (5) A REQUIREMENT THAT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL DEVELOP AND
- 23 IMPLEMENT A METHOD FOR NOTIFYING THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS
- 24 OF THE SCHOOL'S POLICY UNDER THIS SECTION AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH
- 25 SCHOOL YEAR; AND
- 26 (6) AN ONGOING PROCESS FOR OVERSIGHT AND MONITORING BY A
- 27 LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE POLICY
- 28 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 29 (D) (1) AN AUTHORIZED LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER MAY
- 30 PROVIDE BRONCHODILATORS TO A SCHOOL NURSE OR ANY OTHER SCHOOL
- 31 PERSONNEL FOR USE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.

- 1 (2) BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING 2 INHALERS WITH SPACERS, USED BY A SCHOOL NURSE OR ANY OTHER SCHOOL 3 PERSONNEL MUST BE FROM A LICENSED PHARMACY OR MANUFACTURER.
- 4 (3) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY ACCEPT DONATED 5 BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, INCLUDING INHALERS WITH
- 6 SPACERS, FROM A LICENSED PHARMACY OR MANUFACTURER.
- 7 (4) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY APPLY FOR GRANTS TO OBTAIN 8 FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF BRONCHODILATORS AND MODES OF DELIVERY, 9 INCLUDING INHALERS WITH SPACERS.
- 10 (E) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, A SCHOOL
  11 NURSE OR ANY OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL WHO RESPOND IN GOOD FAITH TO THE
  12 ASTHMA ATTACK OR RESPIRATORY DISTRESS OF A CHILD IN ACCORDANCE WITH
  13 THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE HELD PERSONALLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION
  14 IN THE COURSE OF RESPONDING TO THE CHILD IN DISTRESS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
