8	COMMENDING SENATOR RICHARD SHELBY FOR HIS DEDICATED
9	SERVICE TO THE STATE OF ALABAMA.

11	WHEREAS, Senator Richard Shelby has served the State
12	of Alabama in the United States Congress since 1979, first as
13	a Representative of the 7th Congressional District for four
14	terms, and then as United States Senator following election in
15	1986; in February of 2021, Senator Shelby announced that he
16	would not seek reelection after more than four decades of
17	representing this great state; and
18	WHEREAS, born on May 6, 1934, in Birmingham,
19	Alabama, to Alice S. and Ozie Houston Shelby; Richard Shelby
20	graduated from Hueytown High School in Hueytown, Alabama, in
21	1953; he went on to receive his undergraduate and law degrees
22	from the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa and practiced law
23	in Tuscaloosa for 15 years; this legal and legislative
24	education would serve him well throughout his career, to the
25	benefit of the people he represented; and
26	WHEREAS, Richard Shelby worked as a city prosecutor
27	in Birmingham from 1963 to 1971; during that time, he also

served as a U.S. magistrate for the Northern District of
Alabama and as Special Assistant Attorney General of Alabama;
he was elected to the Alabama Senate in 1970, where he served
the 16th State Senate District until his election to the
United States House of Representatives in 1978; and

WHEREAS, immediately upon his inauguration into Congress, Richard Shelby's conservativism was apparent; he immediately began crafting and introducing legislation to provide for a "flat tax," to decrease the size of government, and to oppose what he labeled "government bailouts," which have remained his priorities throughout his tenure; he has introduced a flat tax in every Congress since his election to the United States Senate, as well as a Balanced Budget amendment to the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Senator Shelby's unwavering commitment to low taxes and small government earned him seats on all of the following committees: The Senate Committee on Appropriations, as former chair and current vice chair; Appropriations

Subcommittee on Commerce, Justice and Science, of which he served as chair; Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense, of which he served as vice chair; Appropriations Subcommittee on Energy and Water Development; Appropriations Subcommittee on Homeland Security; Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies, of which he served as chair; Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies; the Senate Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban

Affairs, of which he formerly served as chair and is the longest-serving member in the history of the United States; the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration, of which he formerly served as chair; the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works; and the Joint Committee of Congress on the Library, of which he formerly served as vice chair; and

WHEREAS, Senator Richard Shelby has always had an eye for helping those within his state; he has played an instrumental role in supporting Department of Defense,
National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and Federal
Bureau of Investigation projects throughout the state, most notably in Huntsville; his support of all universities in
Alabama is well-known, through securing research dollars and helping to build state-of-the-art campus infrastructure; in addition, he has maintained a strong focus on the Mobile area through support of the Port of Mobile and the Alabama Port Authority, the Mobile airport, and the area's shipbuilding industry, among other local and statewide interests; and

WHEREAS, throughout his time in public service,
Senator Richard Shelby has been supported and strengthened by
his loving wife, Annette Nevin Shelby, with whom he has raised
two sons, Richard Craig, Jr., and Claude Nevin; in addition to
being the Senator's faithful companion, she independently
claims many accomplishments, including: A Bachelor of Arts and
Master of Arts from the University of Alabama and a Ph.D. from
Louisiana State University; membership in Phi Beta Kappa and
Phi Kappa Phi; a tenure of two decades as a professor in the

McDonough School of Business at Georgetown University, where she was the first woman to become a full tenured professor; and service as director of both the Georgetown graduate and undergraduate programs at Oxford University; her cumulative teaching experience exceeds 30 years, and she was named professor emerita at Goergetown University in 1991; after 50 years together, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Shelby are truly an Alabama power couple for the ages; and

WHEREAS, the endless efforts of Senator Richard Shelby throughout his time in Congress were felt here in Alabama, as his tenure directly coincided with, and indubitably helped ensure, increased prosperity, industrial relevance, and economic advancement throughout the state; a humble leader and a true statesman, the world has seen only a select few Alabamians of such character and quality, and he has represented this state and its peoples in the best manner imaginable; now therefore,
