- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor, rather than the Mayor and the President of 4 the City Council of Baltimore City, to appoint the members of the Board of License 5 Commissioners for Baltimore City with the advice and consent of the Senate; 6 authorizing the Governor, rather than the Mayor and the President of the City 7 Council of Baltimore City, to remove a member of the Board for certain infractions; 8 clarifying that the Board and employees of the Board must comply with State ethics 9 requirements, rather than Baltimore City ethics requirements; and generally 10 relating to the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,



- 12-202.1 2 The [Mayor] GOVERNOR shall appoint [two regular members to the (a) 3 Board and the President of the City Council shall appoint one regular member THREE **REGULAR MEMBERS** and one substitute member to the Board. 4 5 (2) The appointments shall be made: 6 (i) if the Senate is in session, with the advice and consent of the 7 Senate; or 8 if the Senate is not in session, by the Mayor or President of the (ii) 9 City Council GOVERNOR ALONE, subject to the advice and consent of the Senate when 10 the Senate next convenes. (b) Each member of the Board shall be: 11 (1) 12 (i) a resident and voter of the City; and 13 an individual of high character and integrity and of recognized (ii) 14 business capacity. 15 At least one member of the Board shall be a member of the Bar of the (2)Supreme Court of Maryland. 16 17 When evaluating an applicant for membership on the Board, the [Mayor and the President of the City Council] GOVERNOR shall consider the need for 18 19 geographic, political, racial, ethnic, cultural, and gender diversity on the Board. 20 (c) The substitute member may serve on the Board if a regular member is absent 21or recused. 22(d) The term of a member is 2 years and begins on July 1. (1) 23 The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms 24provided for members of the Board on July 1, 2016. 25At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies. 2627 A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the 28rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (e) (1) To fill a vacancy that occurs during the term of office, **THE GOVERNOR** 30 **SHALL APPOINT** an eligible individual [shall be appointed by:

  - (c) (1) An employee of the Board shall devote the employee's whole time and

the Governor containing the resignation of the member from the Board.

1 attention to the business of the Board during the hours designated by the Board for the 2performance of official duties. 3 (2)An employee of the Board may not: 4 engage in an occupation, a business, or a profession that in any (i) way is connected or associated, directly or indirectly, with the manufacture, distribution, 5 or sale of alcoholic beverages; or 6 7 transact any business beyond the official duties of the employee: (ii) with a license holder; or 8 1. 9 2. in connection with the operation of an establishment 10 licensed for the manufacture, distribution, or sale of alcoholic beverages. 11 (3)Subject to § 12–206(e)(1) of this subtitle, an employee of the Board who 12 violates this subsection shall be removed. 13 (d) (1)A member or an employee of the Board shall comply with the public 14 ethics laws of the [City] STATE and the financial disclosure [provisions enacted by the Mayor and City Council REQUIREMENTS SET BY THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION. 15 16 (2)An action of a member or an employee of the Board is subject to State 17 requirements for open or public meetings, including requirements for open sessions under Title 3 of the General Provisions Article. 18
