- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Mark Takai Atomic
- 5 Veterans Healthcare Parity Act".

7	Section 1112(c)(3)(B) of title 38, United States
8	Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
9	clause:
10	"(v) Cleanup of Enewetak Atoll during the
11	period beginning on January 1, 1977, and end-
12	ing on December 31, 1980.".
