

# 117TH CONGRESS H.R. 7114

To impose retaliatory tariffs on Chinese goods for financially supporting Russia through the increased purchases of Russian agricultural products during Russia's ongoing invasion of Ukraine, and for other purposes.

# A BILL

To impose retaliatory tariffs on Chinese goods for financially supporting Russia through the increased purchases of Russian agricultural products during Russia's ongoing invasion of Ukraine, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop China's Financ-
- 5 ing of Russia's Invasion Act".

### 1 SEC. 2. CERTIFICATION BY UNITED STATES TRADE REP-

- 2 RESENTATIVE.
- Not later than 10 days after the date of the enact-
- 4 ment of this Act, the United States Trade Representative
- 5 shall certify to the President whether China has increased
- 6 the volume of wheat and barley imported from Russia rel-
- 7 ative to the volume imported on February 1, 2022.

#### 8 SEC. 3. IMPOSITION OF ADDITIONAL TARIFFS.

- 9 Upon an affirmative certification under section 2, the
- 10 President shall, using all authorities granted to the Presi-
- 11 dent by the International Emergency Economic Powers
- 12 Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) relating to the regulation
- 13 of imports, impose on each article classifiable under sec-
- 14 tion I, II, or III of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
- 15 the United States that originates from China and is im-
- 16 ported into the customs territory of the United States (as
- 17 such term is defined in General Note 2 to the Harmonized
- 18 Tariff Schedule of the United States) an additional tariff
- 19 of 20 percent of the value of such article.

#### 20 SEC. 4. RELAXATION OF ADDITIONAL TARIFFS.

- 21 (a) In General.—The additional tariffs imposed
- 22 pursuant to section 3 shall be removed beginning on the
- 23 day after the date described in subsection (b).
- 24 (b) Date Described.—The date described in this
- 25 subsection is the first date on which each of the following
- 26 has occurred:

1	(1) Either—
2	(A) the United States Trade Representa-
3	tive certifies to the President that the volume of
4	Chinese imports of Russian wheat and barley
5	has returned to or fallen below the volume im-
6	ported on February 1, 2022; or
7	(B) the Secretary of State certifies to the
8	President that the Russian invasion of Ukraine
9	has ceased.
10	(2) The President transmits to Congress the
11	applicable certification described in paragraph (1).
12	(3) There is enacted statutory approval of such
13	certification and for the removal of the additional
14	tariffs.
15	SEC. 5. COOPERATION AND ACCOUNTABILITY AT THE
