Mr. Perdue (for himself and Mr. Peters) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a pilot program to provide access to magnetic EEG/ EKG-guided resonance therapy to veterans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "No Hero Left Un-
- 5 treated Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance ther-
- 9 apy has successfully treated more than 400 veterans

- with post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, military sexual trauma, chronic pain, and opiate addiction.
  - (2) Recent clinical trials and randomized, placebo-controlled, double-blind studies have produced promising measurable outcomes in the evolution of magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy.
  - (3) The outcomes described in paragraph (2) have resulted in escalating demand from returning members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are seeking access to magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy.
  - (4) Congress recognizes the importance of initiating innovative pilot programs that demonstrate the use and effectiveness of new treatment options for post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, military sexual trauma, chronic pain, and opiate addiction.

- 21 (a) PILOT PROGRAM.—Commencing not later than 22 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the 23 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall carry out a pilot pro-24 gram to provide access to magnetic EEG/EKG-guided res-

- 3 (b) Locations.—The Secretary shall carry out the
- 4 pilot program under subsection (a) at not more than two
- 5 facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 6 (c) Participants.—In carrying out the pilot pro-
- 7 gram under subsection (a), the Secretary shall provide ac-
- 8 cess to magnetic EEG/EKG-guided resonance therapy to
- 9 not more than 50 veterans.
- 10 (d) Duration.—The Secretary shall carry out the
- 11 pilot program under subsection (a) for a one-year period.
- 12 (e) Report.—Not later than 90 days after the termi-
- 13 nation of the pilot program under subsection (d), the Sec-
- 14 retary shall submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
- 15 of the Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
- 16 the House of Representatives a report on the pilot pro-
- 17 gram.
- 18 (f) No Authorization of Appropriations.—No
- 19 additional amounts are authorized to be appropriated to
- 20 carry out the requirements of this section. Such require-
- 21 ments shall be carried out using amounts authorized
- 22 under provisions of law other than this section.
