3	(2) (a)	The department[of Vehicle Regulation] shall:
4		<u>1.</u> Provide and receive information on the insurance status of <u>motor</u>
5		vehicles registered in [the Commonwealth of] Kentucky in accordance
6		with this section and [pursuant to] KRS 304.39-087 and 304.39-085:[-
7		The department shall provide appropriate insurance information to the
8		Commonwealth Office of Technology for inclusion in the AVIS
9		database to assist in identifying uninsured motor vehicles]
10		2. Establish an accessible online insurance verification system that:
11		a. Is used for verification of whether motor vehicles are covered by
12		the security required under KRS 304.39-080;
13		b. Is interfaced with AVIS;
14		c. Beginning not later than October 1, 2026, is:
15		i. Operational; and
16		ii. Available to insurers;
17		d. Beginning not later than January 1, 2027, is accessible by
18		requestors to assist the requestors in the identification of motor
19		vehicles that are not in compliance with KRS 304.39-080; and
20		e. Includes information that enables the department to make
21		inquiries to insurers by using multiple data elements for greater
22		matching accuracy;
23		3. On or before January 1, 2026, promulgate an emergency and ordinary
24		administrative regulation in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to
25		establish, implement, and effectuate the accessible online insurance
26		verification system, which:
27		a. Shall:

1	i. Except as otherwise provided in this section, establish
2	guidelines and requirements for the system that are
3	consistent with IICMVA guidelines;
4	ii. Include appropriate provisions to secure the system's data
5	against unauthorized access;
6	iii. Specify, in accordance with subsection (3) of this section,
7	the information that insurers shall electronically submit,
8	and the format, manner, and frequency of the electronic
9	submissions, to the system for personal motor vehicles and
10	commercial motor vehicles; and
11	iv. Establish a period of not less than six (6) months but not
12	more than twelve (12) months from the date of all requests
13	and responses that system data shall be retained; and
14	b. May establish an alternative method of reporting, in lieu of
15	reporting to the system, for insurers who write one thousand
16	(1,000) or fewer policies or contracts that provide coverage for
17	the security required under KRS 304.39-080; and
18	4. Make any amendments to the administrative regulation promulgated
19	under this section or any other administrative regulation related to the
20	system that are necessary to establish, implement, operate, or maintain
21	the accessible online insurance verification system, which shall
22	include any necessary improvements to or replacement of the system.
23	(b) The department may contract with a private service provider who has
24	successfully implemented similar systems in other states to assist in
25	establishing, implementing, operating, and maintaining the accessible
26	online insurance verification system.
27	(c) 1. Notwithstanding KRS 13A.100, the department shall:
