Baltimore City - Property Tax - Retroactive Exemption

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a person who applies for certain property tax exemptions for real property in Baltimore City to request that the exemption be applied retroactively for a certain period of time, subject to certain requirements; requiring Baltimore City and the State to pay a refund of excess real property taxes paid due to a retroactive exemption that is granted; and generally relating to property tax exemptions.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect June 26
- 27 1.2023.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 29
- been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 30
- 31 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- enacted. It shall remain effective through December 31, 2026, and, at the end of December 32
- 31, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 33
- abrogated and of no further force and effect. 34
