2 Water Pollution Control - Intervention in Civil Actions - Rights and Authority

- FOR the purpose of establishing that a person who meets the threshold standing requirements under the federal Clean Water Act has an unconditional right and the authority to intervene in a certain civil action that the State brings to require compliance with certain water pollution control measures; establishing that a person who meets certain requirements to intervene has the same rights as an interested person or aggrieved party under the federal Clean Water Act; and generally relating to intervention in civil actions on water pollution control.

- 19 (A) A PERSON WHO MEETS THE THRESHOLD STANDING REQUIREMENTS
- 20 UNDER THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT HAS AN UNCONDITIONAL RIGHT AND THE
- 21 AUTHORITY TO INTERVENE IN A CIVIL ACTION THAT THE STATE BRINGS IN STATE
- 22 COURT TO REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH:
 - (1) THIS SUBTITLE;

- 1 (2) REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE 2 WITH THIS SUBTITLE; OR
- 3 (3) ANY DISCHARGE PERMIT, EFFLUENT LIMITATION, OR ORDER 4 ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE.
- 5 (B) A PERSON WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS TO INTERVENE UNDER 6 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION HAS THE SAME RIGHTS AS AN INTERESTED 7 PERSON OR AGGRIEVED PARTY UNDER THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT, 8 INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO APPLY FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW AND APPEAL.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2021.
