15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19	(a) (1)	In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
20	(2)	"Credential holder" has the meaning stated in § 16–1001 of this title.
21	(3)	"Display" means the manual surrender of the licensee's license into the

hands of the demanding officer for inspection.

- 1 (4) "Electronic credential" has the meaning stated in § 16–1001 of this title.
- 2 (b) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, 3 EACH individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shall have his license with him.
- 5 (c) (1) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS 6 SECTION, EACH individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shall 7 display the license to any uniformed police officer who demands it.
- 8 (2) A credential holder is deemed to have satisfied the display requirement 9 under paragraph (1) of this subsection only if the uniformed police officer is able to access 10 the verification system authorized under § 16–1003 of this title.
- 11 (d) SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (C) OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY TO AN
 12 INDIVIDUAL WHOSE LICENSE HAS BEEN CONFISCATED BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT
 13 OFFICER WITHIN THE PREVIOUS 90 DAYS FOR FAILURE TO SUBMIT THE DOCUMENTS
 14 REQUIRED UNDER § 16–106 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 15 **(E)** Each individual driving a motor vehicle on any highway in this State shall, if 16 requested by the officer, sign his usual signature in the presence of the officer so that the 17 officer may determine whether he is the licensee.
 - [(e)] **(F)** A person may not give the name of another person or give a false or fictitious name to any uniformed police officer who is attempting to determine the identity of a driver of a motor vehicle.
 - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through December 31, 2024, and, at the end of December 31, 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
