## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Transportation - Commission to Study Establishing a Baltimore Regional 3 Transit Authority 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission to Study Establishing a Baltimore Regional 5 Transit Authority; requiring the Commission to conduct a comprehensive study of 6 establishing a Baltimore Regional Transit Authority; and generally relating to the Commission to Study Establishing a Baltimore Regional Transit Authority. 7 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That: 10 (a) There is a Commission to Study Establishing a Baltimore Regional Transit 11 Authority. 12 (b) The Commission consists of the following members: 13 (1) the Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary's designee; 14 (2) the Maryland Transit Administrator, or the Administrator's designee; (3)(i) three members appointed by the Mayor of Baltimore City; 15 16 (ii) two members appointed by the Baltimore County Executive; 17 (iii) one member appointed by the Anne Arundel County Executive; 18 and 19 (iv) one member appointed by the Howard County Executive; 20 **(4)** (i) one Senator appointed by the President of the Senate; and

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
