- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county or an Equitable Community Investment Council

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis

- 23 (a) (1) There is a Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund.

- 1 (2) The purpose of the Fund is to provide funds to community—based 2 organizations that serve communities determined by the Office of Social Equity, in 3 consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, to have been the most impacted by 4 disproportionate enforcement of the cannabis prohibition before July 1, 2022.
- 5 (b) (1) Based on the percentage allocable to each county determined by the 6 Office of Social Equity and reported by the Office to the Comptroller on or before July 31 each year, the Comptroller shall distribute funds from the Fund to each county in an 8 amount that, for the period from July 1, 2002, to January 1, 2023, both inclusive, is 9 proportionate to the total number of cannabis possession charges in the county compared to the total number of cannabis possession charges in the State.
