A BILL

To establish the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "Amache National Historic Site Act". SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS. 7 In this Act: 8 (1) MAP.—The term "Map" means the map enti-9 tled "Amache National Historical Site Proposed 10 Boundary", numbered 100/175348 and dated July 11 2021. 12 (2) National Historic Site.—The term "Na-13 tional Historic Site" means the Amache National 14 Historic Site established by section 3(a). 15 (3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means 16 the Secretary of the Interior. SEC. 3. AMACHE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE. 18 (a) Establishment.—Subject to subsection (c), there is established the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a unit of the National Park System. 21 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of the National Historic Site is to preserve, protect, and interpret for the benefit of present and future generations resources associated with— 24 (1) the incarceration of civilians of Japanese an-25 cestry during World War II at Amache, also known

1	as the Granada Relocation Center, and the military						
2	service of center incarcerees;						
3 (2) public reaction in the State of Colora							
4	the incarceration of Japanese Americans, including						
5	the position of Governor Ralph Carr and the loca						
6	community; and						
7	7 (3) the transition of the incarcerees and their						
8	8 scendants following the closure of the center and res						
9	tlement in the State of Colorado and other States.						
10	0 (c) Determination by the Secretary.—The R						
11	1 tional Historic Site shall not be established until the de						
12	on which the Secretary determines that a sufficient quan						
13	tity of land or interests in land has been acquired to con-						
14	stitute a manageable park unit.						
15	(d) Notice.—Not later than 30 days after the Sec-						
16	retary makes a determination under subsection (c), the Sec-						
17	retary shall publish in the Federal Register notice of the						
18	establishment of the National Historic Site.						
19	(e) Boundary; Map.—						
20	(1) BOUNDARY.—The boundary of the National						
21	Historic Site shall be as generally depicted on the						
22	Map.						
23	(2) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map shall be on						
24	file and available for public inspection in the appro-						
25	priate offices of the National Park Service.						

1	(f) Land Acquisition Authority.—The Secretary					
2	2 may acquire any land or interests in land located with					
3	3 the boundary of the Camp Amache National Historic La					
4	mark, as generally depicted on the Map, by—					
5	(1) donation;					
6	6 (2) purchase from a willing seller with dona					
7	or appropriated Funds; or					
8	(3) exchange.					
9	(g) Addition to Boundary.—Any lands or interests					
10	in land acquired under paragraph (1) shall be included					
11	within the boundary of the National Historic Site.					
12	(h) Administration.—					
13	(1) In General.—The Secretary shall admin-					
14	ister the National Historic Site in accordance with—					
15	(A) this Act; and					
16	(B) the laws generally applicable to units of					
17	the National Park System.					
18	(2) Management plan.—					
19	(A) Deadline for completion.—Not					
20	later than 3 years after the date on which funds					
21	are first made available to the Secretary for this					
22	purpose, the Secretary shall prepare a general					
23	management plan for the National Historic Site					
24	in accordance with section 100502 of title 54,					
25	United States Code.					

1	(B) Submission to congress.—On com-					
2	pletion of the general management plan under					
3	3 subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall submit					
4	4 the Committee on Energy and Natural Resou					
5	of the Senate and the Committee on Natural 1					
6	sources of the House of Representatives the ge					
7	eral management plan prepared under that su					
8	B $paragraph.$					
9	(i) Administrative Facilities.—For the purposes of					
10	ensuring the preservation, protection, and proper manage-					
11	ment of the site and associated resources, the Secretary may					
12	2 establish facilities for administration, visitor services, a					
13	3 curation of personal property, outside the boundary of, an					
14	in the vicinity of, the National Historic Site.					
15	(j) Cooperative Agreements.—The Secretary may					
16	enter into agreements with—					
17	(1) the public or private entities for the purpose					
18	of establishing and operating facilities outside of the					
19	boundary of the National Historic Site for adminis-					
20	tration, visitor services and curation of personal					
21	property; and					
22	(2) other public or private entities for the pur-					
23	poses of carrying out this Act.					
24	(k) Effect on Water Rights.—Except as provided					
25	for in subsection (l), nothing in this Act shall affect—					

1	(1) the use, attocation, ownership, or control, in					
2	existence on the date of the enactment of any water,					
3	water right, or any other valid existing right;					
4	(2) any vested absolute or decreed conditional					
5	5 water right in existence on the date of the enactm					
6	6 (3) any interstate water compact in existence					
7	7 the date of the enactment; or					
8	8 (4) State jurisdiction over any water law.					
9	(1) Operation and Maintenance of Water Infr.					
10	STRUCTURE AND APPURTENANCES.—					
11	(1) The town of Granada, Colorado, shall main-					
12	2 tain responsibility for the operation and maintenan					
13	of all water infrastructure, systems and appur-					
14	tenances located within the boundary of the National					
15	Historic Site in existence on the date of enactment of					
16	this Act, including but not limited to wells, pumps,					
17	tanks, water lines, valves, and water treatment facili-					
18	ties.					
19	(2) The Secretary shall provide the town of Gra-					
nada, Colorado, with access to those areas of						
21 tional Historic Site determined as necessary fo						
22	operation and maintenance of water infrastructure					
23	and appurtenances.					
24	(3) The Secretary may permit the city of Gra-					
25	nada, Colorado, to construct or install new water in-					

- frastructure, systems and appurtenances consistent
 with applicable laws, limited only to those areas determined in subsection (i)(2), and in a manner that
 ensures the preservation, protection, and proper management of the National Historic Site.
- 6 (4) At such time that all water infrastructure, 7 systems and appurtenances located within the bound-8 ary of the National Historic Site are no longer uti-9 lized by the city of Granada, Colorado, associated im-10 provements and associated water rights may be ac-11 quired through donation to and made part of the Na-12 tional Historic Site in a condition satisfactory to the 13 Secretary.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to establish the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a Unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.".

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
